

INDUSTRIAL POLLUTION NEEDS TO BE CURBED TO PROTECT ENVIRONMENT: JUSTICE GOEL

GLS Law College organised an international conference on Green Justice: Contemporary Challenges of Environment and Sustainable Development on February 29 and March 1, 2020.

Inaugurating the international conference at GLS Law College, the Chief Guest of the function Justice Adarsh Kumar Goel, viewed India is most polluted country according to Global Pollution Index. Thus scientists are issuing red signals in this regard. Reducing the pollution in vast country is a challenging task. India should focus on garbage and civic management. Industries are



causing maximum pollution. So pollution will be curbed by effective management of industrial pollution. Quoting a figure, the Chief Guest viewed India's 351 rivers have been polluted due to flow of sewage waste into the river. Eco friendly treatment of sewage waste was recommended by the guest.

The sea level is continuously increasing due to rising pollution. The ocean

level has increased 0.19 metres in India inundating the coast line areas. Ten countries in the world have already declared environmental emergency, India should follow the suit.

Citing the reference of bushfire in Australia, Shri Satya S. Tripathi, UN Assistant Secretary-General and Head of New York Office, UNEP, cautioned the countries have no time to fight against climate

change. Hence the efforts to reduce environmental degradation should be expedited. He deeply appreciated and commented Indian judiciary is very open and taking suo moto cognisance of environmental issues.

Echoing the line of human security issues, honourable (Dr.) Justice Kaushal Thaker, Judge, High Court of Judicature, Allahabad, viewed that industries are causing pollution; thus human settlements should be away from industrial belt. GIT: A DISTRIBUTED VERSION-CONTROL SYSTEM

Open Source softwares have penetrated the globe at great speed. According to Gartner: "By 2022, more than 70% of new in-house applications will be developed on an Open Source Database Management System (OSDBMS) or OSDBMS-based Database Platform-as-a-Service (dbPaaS)." The research report further states that, "89% of organizations reported using free or open source software". The rapid increase in the usage of open source softwares has also increased to number of alternate softwares available in the market. More softwares means more lines of code.

As we are aware the software products are updated very frequently. Major updates in a software are usually released as versions. Hence we have software version 1, version 2 and so on. Developers face big problem in terms of maintaining these codes once the software is finalized and released in market. To make a life of developers easy, software version control systems comes in handy. Git is a distributed version-control system for tracking changes in source code during software development. It is used by developers to maintain versions of their codebase.

Git is one of the most popular DevOps tools, widely used across the software

industry. It's a distributed SCM (Source Code Management) tool, loved by remote teams and open source contributors. Git allows you to track the progress of your development work. You can save different versions of your source code and return to a previous version when necessary. To integrate Git with your DevOps workflow, you also need to host repositories where your team members can push their work. Currently, the two best online Git repo hosting services are GitHub and Bitbucket. GitHub is more well-known, but Bitbucket comes with free unlimited private repos for small teams (up to five team

members). With GitHub, you get access only to public repos for free—which is still a great solution for many projects.

The advantages of Git source control systems:

Git has few advantages like Branching and Merging, Speed in usage, Availability of multiple copies, Data assurance and available as an open source entity. Let us look at these benefits in brief.

Branching and Merging

The Git feature that really makes it stand apart from nearly every other SCM out there is its branching model. Git allows and encourages you

to have multiple local branches that can be entirely independent of each other. The creation, merging, and deletion of those lines of development takes seconds.

This means that you can do things like:

- Frictionless Context Switching
- Role-Based Codelines
- Feature Based Workflow
- Disposable Experimentation

Small and Fast

With Git, nearly all operations are performed locally, giving it a huge speed advantage over centralized systems that constantly have to

communicate with a server somewhere.

Distributed

One of the nicest features Git is that it's distributed. This means that instead of doing a "checkout" of the current tip of the source code, you do a "clone" of the entire repository.

Data Assurance

The data model that Git uses ensures the cryptographic integrity of every bit of your project.

Staging Area

Unlike the other systems, Git has something called the "staging area" or "index", which is an intermediate area where commits can be formatted and reviewed before completing the commit.

Free and Open Source

Git is free and open-source software distributed under the terms of the GNU General Public License version 2.




category award was lifted by Mr. Neeraj Kumar Gupta, Institute of Law, Nirma University.

START-UPS: ISSUES AND CHALLENGES

The accomplishments of start-ups like Ola, PayTm, Byjus, OYO, Republic has initiated talks towards high valuation business models but behind each high valuation model of today, there is particularly greater challenges. There are start-ups, which face challenge to survive particularly once they have crossed the stage of Product/Service acceptability in the market despite of having a feasible commercial prototype. Start-ups can rewrite Indian economy provided promoters become aware of the below listed setbacks confronted.

Delegation of Authority & Responsibility

As the startup scale-up, promoters fail to create appropriate reporting structures which eventually leads to chaotic situation within the organization thus leading to failure of the start-up. Adding tint of structure will make it more organized by delegation of authority & responsibility to functional specialists to a specific task which requires unique competency mix. At the same time, it is necessary to see that the laying of structures do not go too extreme killing the essence of start-up. By this I mean that start-up should have a flat structure rather than a

tall structure so that the layers/hierarchies are narrowed to continue with the quick decision-making process.

Evolution Path is common but not Normative

Each start-up has their own path of evolving from a start-up to a matured organization. Frequently it is observed that start-up plans are inspired from modus operandi of successful start-up/well established company from another state/country. The massive error done at this stage is to imitate other's path of evolution, which definitely is not same for all start-ups as it may differ in size, economy, strategy and competition. The promoters cannot blindly follow others evolving stages as there is no universal path of evolution defined.

Intrapreneurial culture

The lifeline of any start-up surrounds within the intrapreneur spirit that motivates youths to join any start-up. Close-working relationship help to establish an atmosphere of trust that facilitates the accomplishment of visions and objectives. With the maturity of start-up and expansion in terms of Market & Human Capital, it diverts promoter's attention to more important tasks rather than maintaining the intrapreneur culture alive.

Thus employees may feel a culture shock, which impacts their decision to stay or leave.

Existence Vs. Exploration

With the inflow of funding the promoters are highly motivated to add more variants to the existing business, which may tend to lose their focus from the core operations, which encapsulates the existence of the firm. The promoter has to strike a balance between the motive of existence & exploring novel opportunity recognition.

Right Talent Acquisition

It is talent, which can either ruin or make your business. Generally, start-up requires additional talent with the expansion of its activities. Acquiring talent needs careful consideration by the promoters as they will have specific requirements while screening candidates. Specific requirements here refer to competencies specific to expansion and problems related to expansion, functional expertise as well as those who can settle in the start-up culture. Thus, errors are made while acquiring talent for the expansion as promoters miss out on the specific requirements of expansion.

Marketech




Funkies

This group has got the





Fast and Fresh





Parasite



For the western world, it is a "one-inch tall barrier of subtitles" which they need to jump over to get to world cinema. For us, back in India, this shouldn't be a problem as we are trained to watch movies first in our regional languages, then the mindless junk supplied by Bollywood all the way to Hollywood and its larger than life depiction of the west. So Parasite should not be a problem for any of us to watch and understand, because at the core it talks about class divide which we are not alien to.

Much before it won accolades at the Oscars, it was



awarded the Palme d'or in May 2019, a befitting felicitation to this macabre poetry of two families and their interactions. The plot is simple, a family of 4 on hard times living in a basement apartment tries very hard to make ends meet. They strike gold when the son is referred for a tutoring job at an upscale residence. Through guile and

intelligence, the family manages to infiltrate the upscale family as an English tutor, an art therapist, a driver and a house-keeper. The underhanded techniques they use to get these jobs don't make you frown at them, you smile and root for these poor South Korean inhabitants as they try to earn a living in the poverty stricken economy. On the other hand is the affluent Park family who lives in absolute luxury with their main concern being that the sub-staff should never "cross the line". Parasite juxtaposes the sheer astuteness of the basement dwellers with the naivety of the condo owners.

Giving away the plot of the movie and what happens post the intermission would do injustice to the potential viewers. Thus we shall refrain from doing so. However, the decision of whether one should watch Parasite or not can be based on three things:

the story, the editing and the music. The story cannot be given away, it has twists and turns, funny yet macabre in its progress. But what sets the movie apart from the rest is its editing. Sharp clean cuts and clever timing keep you on the edge of the seat when it wants to while letting you sink back when the characters are having a good time. The editor, Jinmo Yang, ensures that while you feel the joy of pulling a con in the first part of the movie you are also traumatized at what the con results in. He knows when to race this poem of a movie and when to slow it down to a trot. However, the champion of this dark comedy is the music. Jung Jae-il's score lurks in the background like the 11th player, nudging the story ahead. From classical piano scores to operatic music and back to goofy modulations, the music keeps pace with the story telling, almost

intrusively but never "crosses the line".

The movie is recommended for its astute portrayal of class divide and what it can lead to but it does not become didactic. It does not preach economic equality through jingoistic dialogues nor through characters crying their hearts out at the state. It reads like a poem at the first go with prosaic meaning but as you read the first three or four lines you are stuck with an epiphany that there is more to this, there is more to the movie and it is not a simple con story. There is more to what each character is doing and why it is doing it. The movie starts with a shot of the son sitting in the basement and ends with a similar shot, but between these two you are told a compelling narrative which flows like a rhyme.
