INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATIONS AT GLS CAMPUS

The Independence Day celebrations of GLS institutions were arranged at the City Commerce College. Dr. Sarla Achuthan, Director, GLSCRD, hoisted the flag. All the GLS institutions were represented in the celebrations. As a part of the celebration, patriotic songs were sung by the students of GLS institutions.

In her brief address to the audience, Dr. Sarla Achuthan extended a warm welcome and offered her best wishes to the gathering on the country's 68th Independence Day on behalf of Gujarat Law Society. She further expressed her respect to the freedom fighters and the great leaders of the country who made sacrifices for the country's independence.

She said that India had become a great country among the comity of nations and it was the appropriate time to remember the contributions made by our country to the world: The concept of zero, the game of chess, a number of concepts in algebra, trigonometry and calculus, the



first university, the earliest school of medicine and the birth place of four religions, to name a few. It was said that the word and concept of "PRAYER" was also a gift to the world by India.

She added that India was a land of diversities. The magnitude of diversities was mindboggling: More than 350 languages, more than 1600 dialects, nearly 650 different tribes, hundreds of varieties of food items which had taken the world by storm, which had borne out that there was unity in



diversity. She emphasised that we as educationists and teachers had also to share the responsibility of nation-building. For that, according to her, three things were required:
1) The teachers should become the conscience keepers of the society. Only then they

could provide value education to the students.
2) Our educational system had been by and large built on British models and more or less remained the same for 67 years. We needed to have many more reforms/changes in our educational system to enhance its equity,

access and quality. Technology and the world had changed drastically over the years. In order to keep pace, we needed to bring in innovations to revolutionise the educational system.

3) Every year, about 15 million young Indians came to the job market. She urged that we as teachers must ensure that the right balance of knowledge, skill and attitude were provided to the students so that they could stand on their feet and the country could leverage the demographic dividend.

She also stated that independent India's greatest strength was its democracy. She quoted somebody who had said that "Democracy means sticking to the rules of the game even when the referee is not looking." Therefore, she concluded by saying that we should join hands to make one and all good citizens of the country by imbibing civic senses, respect for public property, elders and women and by being law abiding.

ABHIVYAKTI : THEATRE WORKSHOP AT SMPIC



The Wonder of Nine!

The number Nine (9) is the most intriguing number. It is often associated with a divine connotation in the mystical thought and religions across the globe from ancient times. There is both, negativity and positivity in this mysterious nine! In all the religions, Hinduism, Christianity and Islamism, the significance of number nine is unique. All the philosophies speak of nine openings for human beings as also the nine months gestation period for the birth which is of course common to all human beings! As we have entered the Ninth month – Septemeber of the year, and are going to celebrate the Navaratri (Festival lasting nine nights), let us have a look at what the number 9 mean to us...



NAVAVIDHA BHAKTI

Shravanam (hearing about God); Keerthanam (singing in praise of God); Smaranam (remembering God); Paada-sevanam (serving the lotus feet of God); Archanam (worshipping God); Vandanam (obeisance/salutations) Daasyam (serving for the cause of God); Sakhyam (Mythri; friendship with God) and Aatma Nivedanam (Saranam/ total surrender to God) are the nine modes of devotion that are paths to liberation.



NAVA RASA

Srungaara (beauty/love); Haasya (mirth); Karuna (compassion); Roudra (anger); Veera (courage/heroism); Bhayaanaka (fearful); Adbhuta (astonishment); Bheebhatsa (disgust); Saantha (tranquility) are nine forms of emotions expressed by human beings according to situations. These passions form the basic factors depicted by the artiste in all types of Indian classical dance like Bharatha naatya; Kuchipudi; Odissi etc.



NAVA DURGA

Goddess Durga is said to have manifested in nine different forms known as Nava Durga. They are Shailaputhri; Brahmacharini; Chandraghanta; Kooshmaanda; Skhandhamatha; Kaathyaayani; Kaalarathri; Maha Gouri; and Siddhidhaathri. Navadurga Stuthi is based on the above names.



NAVARATRI

Navaratri is divided into sets of three days to adore different aspects of the supreme goddess. On the first three days, the Mother is invoked as powerful force called Durga in order to destroy all our impurities, vices and defects. The next three days, the Mother is adored as a giver of spiritual wealth, Lakshmi, who is considered to have the power of bestowing on her devotees the inexhaustible wealth. The final set of three days is spent in worshipping the mother as the goddess of wisdom, Saraswati. In order have all-round success in life, we need the blessings of all three aspects of the divine mother; hence, the worship for nine nights.




NAVARATNA

Vajra (diamond); Vydoorya (Cat's eye); Gomedhika (Hessonite); Pushyaraaga (Yellow sapphire); Marakatha (Emerald); Maanikya (Ruby); Neela (Blue sapphire); Muthya (Pearl) and Pravaala (Coral) are the nine primary gems. These nine gems are associated with Navagrahas, symbolically representing them and are used as a remedy for Navagraha dosha



NAVGRAHA


Sun (Surya); Moon (Chandra); Mars (Kuja or Angaaraka); Mercury (Budha); Jupiter (Guru or Bruhaspathi); Venus (Sukra); Saturn (Shani); Rahu and Kethu together are called Nava Grahas. Though Sun is a star and Moon is a satellite and Rahu; Kethu are shadowy planets, they are referred to as planets in Hindu philosophy resulting in Nava-Grahas (nine planets)



9 IN CHRISTIANITY

the number 9 symbolizes divine completeness or conveys the meaning of finality. Christ died at the 9th hour of the day, or 3 p.m., to make the way of salvation open to everyone. The Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur) is the only one of God's annual Feast days of worship that requires believers to fast for one day. This special day, considered by many Jews to be the holiest of the year, begins at sunset on the 9th day of the seventh Hebrew month (Leviticus 23:32).

Nine also represents the fruits of God's Holy Spirit, which are Faithfulness, Gentleness, Goodness, Joy, Kindness, Long suffering, Love, Peace and Self-control (Galatians 5:22 - 23).



GLS VOICE RECOMMENDS...

RECIPE



Mix Daal Dhokla :

Ingredients:

- Chna dal – 1 Table spoon
- Mung Dal – 1 Table Spoon
- Split mung – 1 Table Spoon
- Tuver Dal - 1 Table Spoon
- Urad dal – 1 Table Spoon
- Green chili paste – 1.5 t-spoon
- Soda bicarb (Khava no soda) – ½ t-spoon (or Eno – 1 pouch)
- Citric acid powder (Limbu na phool easily available in grocery stores) – ¼ t-spoon
- Oil – 1 tsp
- Red chili powder – for garnish
- Sesame seeds – for garnish
- Salt – to taste

Method:

Soak all the daals separately for 4-5 hours. Drain the daals, wash them and grind them together in the mixer until it becomes a paste. The texture should be slightly coarse. Add salt, citric acid powder, green chili paste, oil and mix well. Boil water in a steamer or rice cooker. Take a thali in which you are planning to cook dhoklas. Brush the plate with little oil. Now add soda bi-carbonate powder or Eno to the batter and immediately pour it in a thali for cooking. There should not be a delay after the fruit salt is added to the batter. Put the thali in the steamer and steam it for 12-15 minutes. Take the plate out when the dhoklas are cooked. Now heat some oil in a pan and add green chilis pieces, sesame seeds and red chili powder and sprinkle the mixture on the plate of dhoklas. This tadka will give it an irresistible look! Perfect snack with afternoon tea!

Moong daal Cheela:

Ingredients

- Split green gram skinless (dhuli moong dal) 1/4 cup
- Ginger, roughly chopped 1 1/2 inch piece
- Garlic, roughly chopped 5-6 cloves
- Onion ,roughly chopped 1 medium
- Green chillies, roughly chopped 3
- Salt to taste
- Red chilli powder 1/4 teaspoon
- Oil to shallow fry
- Green chutney 3/4 cup
- Skimmed milk cottage cheese (paneer) 3/4 cup

Method:

Soak moong dal in three cups of water for about half an hour. Drain and grind with ginger, garlic, onion, green chillies and salt to a smooth batter. Add red chilli power and mix well. Heat a tawa and grease it. Spread a ladle full of batter to a thin disc. Drizzle a little oil and cook on medium heat till the underside is done. Carefully flip over, drizzle a little oil and cook till the other side is done too. Spread some green chutney over the chilla. Sprinkle paneer and fold the chilla over to a half moon shape. Serve hot.



Watli Dal

Ingredients:

- Chana Dal(Gram lentil) - 1/2 Cup
- Oil - 1 tbsp
- Mustard seeds - 1 tsp
- Cumin seeds - 1 tsp
- Green chili - 1
- Ginger paste - 1 Tsp
- Red chili powder - 1 tsp
- Turmeric powder - 1 Tsp
- Asafoetida - a pinch
- Salt - 1 1/2 Tsp or to taste
- Sugar - 1/2 Tsp
- Lemon Juice - 1/2 Tbsp
- Shredded coconut - 1 Tbsp
- Onion (finely chopped) – 1 Tbsp
- Raw mango (Finely chopped) – 1 tbsp
- Cilantro - a few to garnish

Method :

Wash and soak chana dal for minimum 2 hours in lukewarm water. Drain excess water and grind it coarsely by adding little water with green chili, ginger and cumin seeds. Heat oil in pan and crackle mustard seeds. Add asafoetida, turmeric powder, red chili powder and ground chana dal. Fry well stirring continuously on medium flame. Add salt, sugar and lemon juice mix well and put the lid and let it cook for 5-7 min on low flame. Garnish with coconut, raw mango, onion and fresh cilantro and serve.
