continued blessings, and to celebrate the foundation of GLS University with its family members and friends, the GLS Navratri Mahotsav was held


this year on a grander scale on October 11, 2015 at the Gujarat University Convention Centre.

EMPLOYEE ENGAGEMENT: TOOL FOR TODAY'S BUSINESS SUCCESS

Employee engagement is a workplace approach designed to ensure that employees are committed to their organisation's goals and values, motivated to contribute to organisational success, and are able at the same time to enhance their own sense of well-being. But is employee engagement something new, or simply old wine (long-standing management approaches) in new (fashionable management-speak) bottles? Is it just the latest management fad? We believe that while it does have clear overlaps with analytical antecedents such as commitment, 'organisational citizenship behaviour', job involvement and job satisfaction, there are also crucial differences.

Despite there being some debate about the precise meaning of employee engagement there are three things we know about it: it is measurable; it can be correlated with performance; and it varies from poor to great. Most importantly employers can do a great deal to impact on people's level of engagement. That is what makes it so important, as a tool for business success.

What do we mean by employee engagement? How

much does a lack of employee engagement cost an organization? What steps can leaders take to make employees want to give it their best? These and other questions are the focus of this article.

Some Interesting Facts:-

- Only 29 percent of employees are actively engaged in their jobs. These employees work with passion and feel a profound connection to their company. People that are actively engaged help move the organization forward.
- Fifty-four percent of employees are not engaged. These employees have essentially "checked out," sleepwalking through their workday and putting time – but not passion – into their work. These people embody what Jack Welch said several years ago. To paraphrase him: "Never mistake activity for accomplishment."
- Seventeen percent of employees are actively disengaged. These employees are busy acting out their unhappiness, undermining what their engaged co-workers are trying to accomplish.

Does engagement really make a difference?

Employee engagement



affects the mindset of people. Engaged employees believe that they can make a difference in the organizations they work for. Confidence in the knowledge, skills, and abilities that people possess – in both themselves and others – is a powerful predictor of behavior and subsequent performance.

The ten C's of Employee Engagement

Ten guru mantras for leaders to engage employees heads, hearts and hands are:-

Connect: Leaders must show that they value employees.

Career: Leaders should provide challenging and meaningful work with opportunities for career advancement.

Clarity: Leaders must communicate a clear vision. People want to understand the vision that senior leadership has for the organization, and the goals that leaders or departmental heads have for the division, unit, or team.

Convey: Leaders clarify their expectations about

employees and provide feedback on their functioning in the organization.

Congratulate: Business leaders can learn a great deal from Wooden's approach

Contribute: People want to know that their input matters and that they are contributing to the organization's success in a meaningful way.

Control: Employees value control over the flow and pace of their jobs and leaders can create opportunities for employees to exercise this control.

Collaborate: Studies show that, when employees work in teams and have the trust and cooperation of their team members, they outperform individuals and teams which lack good relationships.

Credibility: Leaders should strive to maintain a company's reputation and demonstrate high ethical standards.

Confidence: Good leaders help create confidence in a company by being exemplars of high ethical and performance standards.

What Stalwart's comment on Employee engagement:-

Although big consulting firms have been sounding the alarm about disengaged workers for more than 30 years, today 79 percent of businesses are

seriously worried about engagement and retention, according to Deloitte. Globally, only 13 percent of employees are highly engaged. So if employee engagement programs are so effective, why are so many workers still checked out?

It might be a problem with the measuring sticks. That's the argument from Morrison, the HR director for Penguin Random House U.K., who last year launched a vigorous transnational debate on the value of engagement with a single tweet: "Every time I hear the word engagement another part of me dies."

A useful test, Morrison says, is to ask yourself, "How much do I know about my team? Not just how long they've worked here, what their last job was, or how they like their coffee, but who are they? What are their lives about?"

Treat people well, listen to them, and give them room to grow. Don't do that just to squeeze more productivity out of them--they're smart enough to see that coming--but because it's the right thing to do. And if your heart is in the right place, they'll see that too.



SUPREME COURT OF INDIA INVALIDATES NJAC

THE Supreme Court of India on 16th October, 2015 upheld the collegium system and struck down the National Judicial Appointment Commission as unconstitutional after hearing the petitions filed by several persons and bodies with Supreme Court Advocates on Record Association being the first and lead petitioner. The apex court rejected the National Judicial Appointment Commission (NJAC) Act and the 99th Constitutional Amendment which sought to give politicians and civil society a final say in the appointment of judges to the highest courts. According to the NJAC Act, the committee of 6 people was to be constituted who were, the Chief Justice of India, Law Minister, two senior most Supreme Court Judges and lastly 2 eminent persons who are to be chosen by Prime Minister, CJI and leader of opposition. Section 5 and 6 of the NJAC act define the procedure to choose the Supreme

Court and High Court Judges. The NJAC was introduced to replace



the collegium system, where the judges of the Supreme Court and the High Court were selected for transfer and appointment by the committee constituting the Chief Justice of India and 4 senior judges of the Supreme Court. The abovementioned Act was introduced because it was observed that the collegium system was inadequate and there was a lot of corruption going in transfer and appointment of Judges.

The Collegium system is one where the Chief Justice of India and a forum of four senior-most judges of the Supreme Court recommend appointments and transfers of judges. However, it has no place in the Indian Constitution. The system was evolved through

Supreme Court judgments in the re Presidential reference 1998.

The NJAC Act brought with it the amendments to the Constitution namely 124A, 124B, 124C and the articles before enactment which were 124 and 217 of the Constitution that dealt with the appointment of Supreme Court Judges and High Court Judges were repealed but after this judgement they have been re-legislated. The Union of India, in defending the Amendment, did not dispute the fundamental proposition that the maintenance of an independent judiciary is a part of the Constitution's basic structure. Rather, it contended that the Amendment did not affect this admittedly vital feature of the Constitution. The primary question that the Supreme Court had to, therefore, decide was this: does the removal of the prerogative solely vested in the collegium in appointing judges to India's higher judiciary violate the Constitution's basic structure?

According to Justice J.S. Khehar's opinion: "Under the substituted scheme, even if the

Chief Justice of India and the two other senior most Judges of the Supreme Court [next to the Chief Justice of India], consider a nominee to be worthy for appointment to the higher judiciary, the concerned individual may still not be appointed, if any two members of the NJAC opine otherwise. This would be outrightly obnoxious, to the primacy of the judicial component."

The judiciary representatives in the NJAC -- the Chief Justice and two senior-most judges -- can veto any name proposed for appointment to a judicial post if they do not approve of it. Once a proposal is vetoed, it cannot be revived. At the same time, the judges require the support of other members of the commission to get a name through.

The judges who delivered the judgment in the NJAC case also hold the view that an improvement in the working of the collegium system is the need of the hour. They have proposed a hearing on this aspect on November 3.


BOOK REVIEW

THE BASTARD OF ISTANBUL

Although not a very avid reader, I have always believed that while reading a book one relates to certain attributes of a character and that's what touches anybody. But while reading Elif Shafak's The Bastard of Istanbul you don't just relate to just one single character but a lot of things about the various intricately imagined characters and fall in love with the explicit jumble. The story revolves

around two girls: Asya, a Turk and Armanoush, an Armenian-American. While Asya is battling with her identity, Armanoush is trying to find her identity. The plot develops when Armanoush who is moved by the stories of conflicts between the Armenians and the Turks that her ancestors have experienced decides to visit her step-father Mustafa's home in Turkey. Here she meets the Kazanci clan comprising of women so different from each other and yet living together and complementing each other.



Armanoush befriends Asya here. Asya the 19 year old

illegitimate (and therefore, 'bastard') daughter of Zeliha whom she calls "aunt Zeliha" is often baffled by the similarities with her mother but lives in constant denial. Shafak adds more characters in this jumble like Baron Baghdasarian and the others in the cyber group who express their outrage for the atrocities faced by the Armenians and on the other hand the Turk cartoonist and the nationalist friends of Asya from Café Kundera and towards the end the history teacher who is irretrievably in love with Zeliha.

Even though it's a jumble you can't stop yourself from falling in love with the intricately drawn minds. And Istanbul! Anybody reading the book would want to visit to experience the beautiful chaos. Towards the end one is left in this distress but with a smile. Personally I didn't want it to end. So if you are looking for a gripping, moving and heart throbbing experience, this one's highly recommended.


MOVIE REVIEW


The center of the film is an unforgettably gripping, heart-in-your-throat evocation of the unbearable loneliness and terror of ultimate abandonment once its hero, stranded and presumed dead, gives up hope of being rescued but still clings tenaciously to life.

In one of the script's pointed paradoxes, this modern-day Robinson Crusoe, Chuck Noland (Mr. Hanks), is a voluble, time-obsessed efficiency expert for Federal Express. Shortly before boarding a plane that plunges him into the Pacific, he and his girlfriend, Kelly (Helen Hunt), exchange gifts: an engagement ring from Chuck, her grandfather's pocket watch (with her picture inside) from



Kelly. Marooned with only the timepiece to remind him of

home, Chuck finds himself facing only one deadline, the



race to survive in the face of starvation, dehydration and natural disaster.

The screenplay's conceptual master stroke has Chuck revert to childhood through the creation of an imaginary companion so he can survive psychically. Painting a face (in his own blood) on a white Wilson volleyball extracted from a fedexpackage that washes up on shore, he turns Wilson (as he calls the ball) into a fellow survivor, confidant and collaborator in an escape plan. Anyone who recalls being a very young child and clutching a doll that embodies comfort and companionship in times of loneliness and insecurity will relate to the wrenching scenes

in which Chuck clings to Wilson for emotional support. Mr. Hanks physical transformation is as startling and he lost more than 50 pounds for this section of the film

Once Chuck is saved, he appears terminally detached and wears the faraway expression of a man whose traumatic experience has separated him from others. For the rest of his life, we sense, an essential part of him will still be living alone on that island.

In short a beautiful made movie which talks about the ability of fate to alter event the tidiest of life with one major event. A story well said about human survival in the oddest of place in the oddest of ways
