

संवधिान सफर EVENT: PANEL DISCUSSION ON GENDER SENSITIVITY AND THE CONSTITUTION



Gender justice must be allpervasive, encompassing economic, political, and social aspects.

As part of the yearlong celebration of संवधान सफर activities, the Faculty of Law, GLS University, organized the fourth event- a Virtual Panel Discussion on "Gender Justice: संवधान का स्वर" (Voice of the Constitution). The discussion brought together a panel of legal scholars, academicians, and social activists to deliberate on the evolving landscape of gender justice within the Indian constitutional framework. The session featured insightful discussions on gender equality, legal rights, and the challenges in ensuring constitutional safeguards for all genders.

Initiating the discussion, Prof. (Dr.) Manoj Kumar Vice-Chancellor, Sinha. Dharma Shastra National Law University, highlighted how Indian Constitution the provides a robust foundation for gender justice beyond Articles 14, 15, and 16, emphasizing the Directive Principles of State Policy and judicial interpretations. He elaborated on the challenges in implementing gender-sensitive laws, citing hurdles in enforcement and societal resistance despite progressive legislations like the POSH Act, 2013.

Following this, Prof. (Dr.) Pradeep Kulshreshtha, Dean, Bennett School of Law, reflected on the judiciary's role in shaping gender justice. He asserted that while the courts have been instrumental in advancing gender equity, there is a pressing need to move beyond formal equality toward a more substantive approach that addresses systemic barriers and real-world inequalities.

Providing a social work perspective, Dr. Shewli Kumar, Associate Professor, Tata Institute of Social Sciences, emphasized the role of professional social work education in fostering gender justice. She critically examined gender disparities in childhood and how constitutional protections could be strengthened to ensure equal opportunities from an early age. Addressing workplace concerns, she pointed out gaps in legal provisions and the need for stricter enforcement mechanisms for laws like the POSH Act, 2013.

Sharing a media and advocacy perspective, Ms. Deepika Bhardwaj, an independent journalist and equal rights activist, challenged myths common and misinterpretations surrounding gender justice. She discussed the dual role of social media in shaping public opinion, noting that while it amplifies marginalized voices, it also perpetuates biases and misinformation, necessitating responsible digital engagement.

Adding grassroots insights, Ms. Pallavi Rajpal, Joint CEO, Utthan, Gujarat, spoke about barriers preventing marginalized women from accessing constitutional rights, emphasizing intersecting factors of caste, religion, and socioeconomic status. She highlighted the role of NGOs in bridging the policyimplementation gap and called for targeted constitutional and policy reforms to enhance inclusivity and accessibility.

The engaging discourse underscored the importance of continuous dialogue and advocacy to ensure that the Constitution's vision of equality translates into lived realities. The Faculty of Law reaffirmed its commitment to fostering discussions on critical legal and social issues, paving the way for more such knowledgesharing initiatives in the future.
